In 2007, the Transportation for Illinois Coalition succeeded in moving the need for investment in our transportation network to the forefront of public policy discussions in Illinois. Years without capital funding contributed to an elevated demand for capital investment. Tragedies like the Minnesota bridge collapse and Illinois' own share of crumbling infrastructure helped raise public awareness of the need to invest. And TFIC added its substantive experience and analyses to the public discussion to help inform and energize public action. We believe that absent the strained relationships between the legislative leaders and the Governor a comprehensive capital funding measure would have been approved to repair, enhance and expand our highway, transit, rail and airport infrastructure.

Though we didn't win this comprehensive victory in 2007, we can be pleased with the accomplishment of two important goals with regard to transportation. First, the Congress approved and then overrode the President's veto of the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) that significantly increases federal funding for waterways throughout the nation, including the Illinois and Mississippi River transport networks. Illinois is a big winner as a result of this national funding reauthorization measure.

At the state level, Illinois lawmakers did approve a comprehensive operating reform and funding measure for the state's mass transit systems in the Regional Transportation Authority area of metropolitan Chicago, as well as funding for downstate transit districts. More detail about this historic action, which modifies the RTA laws that were last updated in the early 1980s, is found later in this report.

With these successes, the Coalition now looks toward renewing its work in support of a comprehensive capital program that will create thousands of jobs, restore the integrity of our transportation network and lay the groundwork for federal outreach regarding the reauthorization discussion in Congress in 2009. Thanks to the continued dedication of our members and staff, the TFIC has assumed the leadership role in support of Illinois' transportation infrastructure and the economic benefits it provides.

2007 Federal Legislative Goals

- Support passage of the Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) in Congress, which will maintain and enhance our national and Illinois waterways system, which is a critical component of our Illinois transportation infrastructure.
- Perform Washington, D.C. Fly-In to educate the U.S. Congressional Delegation in an effort to build support for the needs and positions of TFIC and our Illinois transportation network.
- Maintain the SAFETEA-LU funding levels for Illinois that the Coalition and its members worked so strongly to obtain in 2005.
- Support the reauthorization of the federal aviation act, which will be up in 2007.

2007 State Legislative Goals

- Reduce diversions from the state's Road Fund
- Achieve passage of a capital program that will adequately fund needed transportation maintenance and improvements for:
 - highways and bridges
 - transit
 - inter-city passenger rail
 - freight rail
 - and small airport infrastructure
- Maintain and ensure equitable distribution of funds throughout the state.
- Provide adequate operational funding for transit systems statewide.

2007 Accomplishments

- At the end of 2007, TFIC and its member organizations celebrated the achievement of one of our primary federal goals with the passage of the Water Resources Development Act in the U.S. Congress. As a result of this legislation, Illinois will see close to 1/3 of this approximately \$23 billion federal investment. TFIC commended its Illinois delegates for their efforts in passing such critical transportation legislation and overriding the President's veto of H.R. 1495. With a portion of these funds, Illinois will be able to improve our waterways and modernize our lock and dam system to become a better steward of the Upper Mississippi River System.
- TFIC successfully raised the profile of transportation and infrastructure issues to being a major focus of Illinois policymakers, legislators, and the public.
- Throughout 2007, TFIC worked closely with the RTA, its service boards CTA, Metra and Pace, and downstate transit districts in their efforts to win approval of comprehensive reform and operating funding for mass transit in Illinois. In January 2008, the General Assembly passed House Bill 656, the reform and operating funding bill. House Bill 656 created additional annual operating funding of \$500 million raised primarily in the RTA region in order to address the mass transit operating funding shortfall. The bill also established reforms designed to improve the coordination and efficiency of the transit system, including the development of a long-term strategic plan for regional transit, capital project evaluation and prioritization criteria, enhanced budget oversight and auditing, and better coordination of service and fares. The bill implemented historic reforms to the CTA pension and retiree health care systems designed to ensure long-term financial stability. Finally, the governing boards for RTA and Metra were adjusted to reflect population shifts in the region. Downstate transit systems also received an additional \$27 million in operating assistance.

2007 Highlights

Communication and Credibility

Over the last six years, TFIC has used various effective methods of communicating with one another, policymakers, and the public at-large. With 70 diverse member organizations, effective communication has proven to be a key factor in the success and credibility of the coalition.

Background research and publication of issue papers.

Policymakers, legislators, and the public alike rely upon TFIC as their primary source to produce credible and thorough research from expert consultant Linda Wheeler as well as our highly skilled member organizations. In 2007, TFIC and its member organizations distributed a transportation needs assessment in conjunction with the statewide push for a capital program. The coalition also took a leading role in the policy discussion by preparing and distributing reports and/or statements detailing and summarizing the condition of Illinois' transportation network, the need for investment and specific proposals for a comprehensive transportation funding program.

The first report, released by TFIC in February, entitled "Invest in Illinois' Transportation Infrastructure/Funding Fact Sheet," discussed the ominous situation with state road fund monies and the critical status of Illinois' transportation network. In March 2007, the coalition worked in collaboration with media firm Jasculca/Terman and Associates to produce "Keep Illinois Moving Forward," a comprehensive, reader-friendly informational booklet outlining the specific needs of each transportation mode and accompanying funding goals. TFIC continued to release well-researched funding assessments – *Make Transportation a Priority in 2007* (May 2007), *Revenue Needs and Sources* (July 2007), *What Illinois Needs in a New Transportation Program* (September 2007), and *Transportation Funding Comparison* (October 2007) – in order to detail the coalition's specific recommendations for a capital program.

TFIC produced "Illinois Bridges: The Facts at a Glance" in October 2007, highlighting the deteriorating status of our Illinois bridges. This was in response to increasing bridge safety

concerns nationwide after the Minnesota bridge collapse in August.

Transportation news clipping service. TFIC continues to email its members copies of news stories dealing with transportation issues throughout the nation.

TFIC Website. In an effort to educate policymakers and the public, TFIC created and continues to maintain an informational website. The site includes TFIC publications such as white papers and annual reports, TFIC activities and events, TFIC communications, fact sheets, and press releases. Transportation news and reports and links to other transportation related websites are also available.

Grassroots Outreach. TFIC organized and coordinated a grassroots outreach network that worked in support of a transportation funding package – capital and operating – in 2007 in Illinois. Volunteers throughout the state wrote letters, made phone calls, and visited legislators in support of transportation funding in Illinois. Grassroots volunteers made the March 14th Transportation Lobby Day a huge success, rallying at the State Capitol in support of increased transportation funding. The coalition's "Letter to the Editor" Campaign produced more than 40 letters in newspapers throughout Illinois, increasing awareness of Illinois' urgent transportation situation.

Presentations to community groups. In 2007, TFIC Consultant Linda Wheeler continued to travel throughout the state, using her expertise and the support of the coalition to spread the message that Illinois' transportation infrastructure is critical to the economic health and vitality of the state. These presentations to community groups are an important way to garner media coverage and educate the public about the importance of this issue in their daily lives. Ms. Wheeler presented transportation funding programs in Aurora, Chicago, Champaign, Springfield, and Peoria.

Testimony at legislative hearings. Often, TFIC members are asked to offer testimony on transportation issues facing the General Assembly, state, and national commissions. TFIC has

earned a highly respected position in the transportation debate as our member organizations provide first-hand knowledge of the subject matter and utilize the expert, well-researched resources of the coalition. In April 2007, TFIC was invited to testify at the National Surface & Transportation Policy and Revenue Study Commission Chicago Field Hearing. The final report for this hearing, entitled “Transportation for Tomorrow: Report of the National Surface Transportation Policy and Revenue Study Commission” was released in early 2008 and is available on the TFIC website. In October 2007, TFIC offered testimony at two other hearings – the Illinois House of Representatives Appropriations Public Safety Committee hearing and the U.S. House Subcommittee on Highways and Transit Field Hearing on Chicagoland Transportation Needs for 2016 Olympic Bid.

Direct communication with policymakers.

Due to TFIC’s reputation as a consensus-building, well-informed coalition, many policymakers and legislators welcome the coalition’s input and expertise and seek TFIC’s support on key transportation initiatives. Since its formation, TFIC has continuously been in contact with policymakers and legislators state- and nation-wide in an effort to communicate the critical need for investment in Illinois’ transportation infrastructure.


TFIC distributes materials to legislators, sends letters to Congress on timely topics, and meets with key policymakers and legislators whenever possible. The coalition also uses various media outlets, grassroots outreach, and an informative website to encourage the public and its member organizations to contact legislators and encourage participation in the transportation debate. Throughout 2007, TFIC brought the transportation needs of Illinois to the top of the priority list for Illinois

legislators by communicating with the Illinois General Assembly Members, Governor Blagojevich, and the Illinois Congressional Delegation. The coalition will continue to develop and maintain important relationships with political leaders and policymakers in order to keep transportation funding at the forefront.

Regular Meetings. TFIC’s steering committee, which is the governing body of the organization, and the nine committees that work under its auspices hold regular meetings throughout the year.

White Papers

TFIC continues to build its large body of work by producing and publishing well-researched white papers on high-interest transportation issues. In 2007, coalition members decided to move forward with producing a white paper on the topic of leasing the Illinois Tollway System, as this topic would likely be of continued interest to policymakers and legislators in 2008. The research on this paper, *Lease the Illinois Tollway? Public Ownership is Better*, was completed in 2007 in preparation for its release in January 2008.



Media Outreach

The coalition has strategically reached out to the media and the public through speaking engagements, press releases, and news briefings/conferences in key congressional districts to communicate the extreme importance of the transportation industry to Illinois’ economy and growth. 2007 was a critical year for TFIC media outreach as funding for a capital program loomed on the horizon. At the beginning of 2007, the coalition enlisted the services of public relations firm Jasculca/Terman and Associates to facilitate this outreach. Jasculca/Terman (JT) contributed to the creation of the TFIC message and materials for all media outreach during the Spring 2007

legislative session. They also assisted co-chairs Michael Carrigan and Doug Whitley in preparation for editorial board visits. JT contributions included multiple press releases, statements, draft letters for the “Letters to the Editor” campaign, and cover letters to General Assembly members and the Governor. JT also helped create signs for press conferences and TFIC folders for Lobby Day. With the help of JT, TFIC held 5 press conferences and members participated in a “Turtle Hat” media stunt in order to create public concern about slow traffic due to roadway congestion.

TFIC worked with JT to produce “Keep Illinois Moving Forward,” a comprehensive, reader-friendly informational booklet introducing the problems plaguing our Illinois transportation system – congestion, disrepair, safety hazards – and how to address them. It provides an overview of each transportation mode – roads, highways, bridges, rail, public transit, water, and air – and the funding needs of each.

In total, TFIC released 14 press releases in 2007 to help keep our message in the media. The coalition, the Illinois Road and Transportation Builders Association, and the Illinois AFL-CIO also co-sponsored a newspaper ad promoting a capital program and the IRTBA’s “Fix Our Roads Now” campaign. These press releases and newspaper campaigns, in combination with TFIC’s Grassroots outreach, community presentations, and the concerted efforts of TFIC’s member organizations, kept transportation funding in the media spotlight.

Diversions

In 2007, TFIC continued to pursue its goal to reduce the diversion of monies from the state’s Road Fund for purposes other than roads and bridges. User fee diversions totaled \$676 million in FY 2007. In years past, TFIC has been successful in reducing these diversions. However, the legislative squabbling and the state’s dismal financial circumstances kept TFIC from eliminating any further diversions from the Road Fund in 2007. Efforts to reduce and hold the line on Road Fund diversions will continue to be a major focus for TFIC.

Events

The mission of the TFIC is to identify issues, aggressively advocate policy and work diligently to secure maximum federal and state funding for the transportation infrastructure needs of Illinois. One way TFIC keeps this message in the forefront is by sponsoring events throughout Illinois and in Washington.

News Conferences. TFIC had an increasingly high profile in the media in 2007, holding five different news conferences throughout the state. On March 12th, East Central Illinois business and labor leaders joined elected officials in **Champaign** in support of TFIC’s statewide campaign for a new transportation funding package. At TFIC’s March 14th Transportation Lobby Day in **Springfield**, the coalition held a press conference to warn of the dire consequences of continuing to defer needed transportation investment and calling on legislators and the Governor to make comprehensive funding for Illinois transportation a priority. At a March 20th press conference at the Thompson Center in **Chicago**, Chicagoland county chairs and mayors joined labor and business leaders to echo this same message. In **Peoria** on March 21st, area business and labor leaders and elected officials also called for a new capital program and a guarantee that these funds not be diverted for other purposes. And finally, on May 10th, TFIC held a news conference at the State Capitol in **Springfield**, outlining the need for investment in Illinois transportation, possible revenue sources for the increase, and the boost this would provide to Illinois’ economy and job growth. These news conferences proved effective, making transportation a top legislative priority. As a result of our efforts, TFIC helped win legislative approval of the transit operating reform and funding measure and has maintained the focus on needed capital investment.

Transportation Lobby Day. Members of TFIC participated in a March 14th Transportation Lobby Day in order to demonstrate the importance of adequate transportation funding to the General Assembly and the public. Hundreds rallied at the Statehouse as the coalition held a press conference to warn of the dire consequences of continuing to defer needed transportation investment. TFIC and the attendees called on legislators and the Governor to make comprehensive funding for Illinois transportation a priority this year. Construction equipment, underused from a lack of state construction projects, lined the streets around the Capitol. TFIC members visited their legislators throughout the day and ended the day with a legislative reception. More than 80 volunteers visited with Illinois legislators and the highly successful event garnered widespread media coverage.

CREATE Rail Rally. TFIC members participated in a February 28 – March 1 Rail Rally in support of CREATE funding. Attendees rode the train to Springfield from Chicago and then gathered at the Capitol to promote investment in rail infrastructure improvements to benefit freight and passenger rail service and, ultimately, the citizens of Illinois.

Washington D.C. Fly-Ins. In February 2007, TFIC coordinated a Washington, D.C. Fly-in where TFIC representatives Doug Whitley, Bill Grams, and Joe Szabo met with Speaker Pelosi’s staff and discussed TFIC’s goals for funding needs and the Speaker’s priorities for federal transportation in 2007. In May 2007 TFIC coordinated another fly-in, during which a record 29 TFIC representatives met with numerous Illinois congressional delegates and other leaders in order to discuss the critical needs of our Illinois transportation infrastructure. Meetings were held with Representatives Kirk, Roskam, Johnson, Davis, Bean, Lipinski, Hare, Biggert, Costello, Weller, Manzullo, and Hastert as well as congressional staff members. During these meetings, TFIC members emphasized the coalition’s 2007 federal goals to achieve maximum funding for waterways, aviation, and SAFETEA-LU reauthorization.

Annual Meeting. TFIC’s annual meeting was held on September 19th, 2007 at the Bolingbrook Golf Club. The annual meeting was successful with a record attendance, including legislative staff, local government leaders, and Congressional staff. The Honorable Roger Claar, Mayor of Bolingbrook, and TFIC member speakers began the day. State Representative Kathy Ryg and State Senators Pamela Althoff and A.J. Wilhelmi followed with a discussion of the status of transportation in Illinois and the Senate passage of a capital bill which included transportation funding. Illinois Comptroller Dan Hynes spoke at lunch to discuss Illinois’ transportation funding outlook. Neil Doyle, Senior Vice President of CenterPoint Properties, spoke about intermodalism in Illinois and its effect on the economic health of our state.

2007 Annual Meeting Highlights



During the afternoon session, TFIC members communicated via teleconference with a panel of key Washington policymakers, legislators and staff. Panelists included U.S. Congressman Dan Lipinski and his Chief of Staff Jason Tai, Jeff Davis, Publisher and Editor of *Transportation Weekly*, Tom Kotarac, staff member of U.S. Senator Dick Durbin, as well as Staff Members of the Senate Committee on Environment & Public Works, the Senate Commerce Committee, and the House Committee on Transportation & Infrastructure.

Passage of Mass Transit Reform and Operating Funding.

Throughout the year, TFIC worked closely with the RTA, its service boards CTA, Metra and Pace, and downstate transit districts in their efforts to win approval of comprehensive reform and operating funding for mass transit in Illinois. In January 2008, the General Assembly passed House Bill 656, the reform and operating funding bill. House Bill 656 created additional annual operating funding of \$500 million raised primarily in the RTA region in order to address the mass transit operating funding shortfall. The bill also established reforms designed to improve the coordination and efficiency of the transit system, including the development of a long-term strategic plan for regional transit, capital project evaluation and prioritization criteria, enhanced budget oversight and auditing, and better coordination of service and fares. The bill implemented historic reforms to the CTA pension and retiree health care systems designed to ensure long-term financial stability. Finally, the governing boards for RTA and Metra were adjusted to reflect population shifts in the region. Downstate transit systems also received an additional \$27 million in operating assistance. Although the bill did provide desperately needed operating funding in order to continue daily service, it did not provide capital funding sorely needed to maintain the existing aging transit system or to expand it to meet the needs of the growing region. TFIC will continue its efforts to gain adequate capital funding for Illinois mass transit.

Leasing the Illinois Tollway

The coalition became engaged in research and discussion in 2006 on an issue that the Illinois General Assembly brought to the forefront – the lease of the Illinois Tollway to a private entity. With the concept of public/private partnerships as a potential financing mechanism for transportation development and management gaining supporters in some states, Illinois lawmakers raised the possibility of leasing the Illinois Tollway as a means of generating funds for transportation and other government programs in Illinois. Previous leases of the Chicago Skyway and an Indiana toll road highlighted the possi-

bility of public/private partnerships and helped to heighten state lawmakers' interest in the subject.

In 2007, the coalition decided to move forward with plans for a release of a white paper on the topic. The white paper, entitled *Lease the Illinois Tollway? Public Ownership is Better*, was released in January 2008. Ultimately the coalition has concluded that a public/private partnership to lease the Illinois Tollway is not a good option for Illinois.

TFIC Structure

The coalition is governed by its steering committee, which acts as a board of directors. The steering committee has two

co-chairs, reflecting the balance between labor and business interests in the coalition and the broad-based interest in transportation.

Upon Margaret Blackshere's retirement in February 2007, Michael Carrigan succeeded her as president of the Illinois AFL-CIO. Together, Michael Carrigan and Doug Whitley, president of the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, served as co-chairs for the remainder of 2007. Other coalition officers were: Sean Stott, vice-chair; Jim Reilly, secretary; and Mike Skarr, treasurer.

Constitutional Amendment Committee

One of the Coalition's primary goals is to maximize funding for transportation. The greatest obstacle to this vision is the diversion of Road Fund money to non-highway related purposes. Motorists in Illinois pay user fees in the form of motor fuel taxes and license fees that were promised to go toward the maintenance of the highway system. Despite this promise, more than \$600 million in road funds are annually diverted for non-highway purposes, shortchanging the users who

pay for these roads. Because the Governor and General Assembly have been unable to restrain themselves from spending highway user money for their own priorities, the Coalition supports the adoption of a Constitutional Amendment to restrict road funds to be used solely for highway needs. This is not a radical concept as more than half of the states in the nation protect their road funds through their Constitution.

Before the public can vote on a Constitutional Amendment, such as this one, the General Assembly must first authorize that vote for an upcoming election. Joint resolutions of the House and Senate have been routinely introduced but have not been given a hearing, much less full debate. While the Coalition will continue efforts to pass a resolution authorizing such a vote, we are also monitoring the upcoming general election where the public is given a chance every twenty years to call for a Constitutional Convention. Should a convention be approved, the Coalition stands ready to put forth our amendment to protect Road Funds from diversions to non-highway related purposes.

Federal Affairs Committee

The Federal Affairs Committee serves as a liaison between the Coalition and Washington, D.C. legislators and policymakers. In 2007, the committee strove to preserve the federal funding allocated to Illinois through the multi-year highway and transit reauthorization measure known as SAFETEA-LU, ensuring an adequate appropriation level for our Illinois transportation needs. Although Illinois' funding appropriations were threatened in 2007, TFIC assisted in efforts to keep this appropriation level as close to the original federal authorization funding level as possible. The Federal Affairs Committee was also successful in its efforts to gain passage of the Water Resources Development Act in the U.S. Congress, which will allow much needed investment in Illi-

nois' waterways. In addition, the Illinois Department of Transportation agreed to the request of the Federal Affairs Committee to have a legislative item on the agenda for every Industry/IDOT policy meeting.

In February 2007, the Federal Affairs Committee coordinated a Washington, D.C. Fly-in where TFIC representatives Doug Whitley, Bill Grams, and Joe Szabo met with Speaker Pelosi's staff and discussed the Speaker's transportation agenda highlights. In May 2007 the committee also coordinated a Fly-in to Washington during which a record 29 TFIC representatives met with every member or staff of the Illinois Congressional delegation. During these meetings, organized by TFIC's Washington lobbyist Michael Flanagan, TFIC members discussed the crucial need for investment in Illinois transportation infrastructure, including such federal funding topics as waterways, aviation, and SAFETEA-LU reauthorization.

In April 2007, TFIC was invited to testify at the National Surface & Transportation Policy and Revenue Study Commission Chicago Field Hearing at which co-chair Doug Whitley appeared on behalf of the organization to discuss freight, business, and mass transit issues related to federal reauthorization. In October 2007, TFIC offered testimony at the U.S. House Subcommittee on Highways and Transit Chicago Field Hearing on transportation needs for the Chicago 2016 Olympic bid.


The Federal Affairs Committee decided to reorganize its efforts in the future to do more education and outreach to the Illinois delegation via meetings in their Illinois districts and concentrate the Washington Fly-ins on meeting with key Washington transportation leaders and the Transportation Committee. Toward the end of 2007, TFIC's Federal Affairs Committee began creating and organizing teams for federal outreach in each Congressional district to inform each Congressional delegate regarding topics and issues of concern to TFIC. The committee also proposed outreach to key national transportation leaders as they visit Illinois.

Mass Transit Committee

In 2007, the Mass Transit Committee worked closely in conjunction with the State House Committee to see that funding investments for public transportation in Illinois would be of high priority in the legislature this year. This includes both operating funding to maintain the current service levels offered to Illinois citizens and capital funding to provide much needed investment in the maintenance and improvement of aging public transit components systemwide.

Membership Committee

Four new organizations joined TFIC in 2007- the United Transportation Union, the DuPage County Department of Economic Development and Planning, the Heartland Partnership in Peoria, and the Lake County Division of Transportation – each of which are strong alliances that fit perfectly with the vision and mission of TFIC. Our 2007 membership level totaled 70 member organizations, 51 of which are providing financial support to the coalition and another 19 of which are lending moral and vocal support to our work.

The Membership Committee will continue in its outreach to new organizations as we unite in 2008 to win approval of a significant capital program for our Illinois transportation infrastructure.

Policy Committee

The Policy Committee is responsible for both the positions the coalition takes on key transportation issues and the fine-tuning of the coalition's mission statement. In 2007, the Committee voted to modify the coalition's vision statement to remove the two words "private sector" in recognition of the fact that TFIC has both public and private sector members.

The committee also recommended that the coalition move forward with the completion and publication of a white paper discussing the leasing of the Illinois Tollway System because this will likely continue to be an issue of concern for state policymakers in 2008.

The Policy Committee consulted with the Constitutional Amendment Committee to decide whether TFIC should take a position in support of a Constitutional Convention in Illinois with the goal of winning approval and inclusion of a constitutional amendment protecting the road fund from raids. The committee is continuing to research this issue and will further monitor the activities of national organizations and interests before recommending TFIC take a position on this issue.

State House Affairs Committee

The State House Affairs Committee is responsible for the development of state-focused legislative and administrative goals and the strategies for achieving these goals. 2007 was a tumultuous year in the Illinois General Assembly as tensions rose among legislators. The State House Committee released a Needs Assessment Summary Fact Sheet to reflect TFIC's findings on Illinois' transportation infrastructure needs. The committee agreed upon the negotiating principles of TFIC for a transportation funding bill, which were:

- Coalition members stick together so everyone wins.
- Adequate funding of highways, bridges, transit, freight rail, passenger rail, and small airport infrastructure.
- Equitable distribution of funding throughout the state for highways.
- Minimize diversions from the Road Fund.
- Equal percentage of increased revenues for local and state roads.
- An increase of \$5 billion per year for the next 5 years (\$2 billion in increased revenue would meet this need).

In order to make a greater impact, the State House Affairs Committee utilized its subcommittees - the Grassroots Committee and the PR Task Force - to educate the public and policymakers about the need for a significant transportation funding proposal and associated revenue increases to pay for it.

The PR Task Force orchestrated a massive PR effort through a "Letter to the Editor" campaign and multiple news and press conferences in Chicago, Springfield, Champaign, and Peoria. They also performed key editorial board visits and radio talk show appearances with the message that increasing investment in our transportation infrastructure will help grow businesses and jobs throughout Illinois. Members also participated in a February 28 - March 1 Rail Rally in support of CREATE funding and a March 14th Transportation Lobby Day in order to demonstrate the importance of adequate transportation funding to the General Assembly and the public.

The Grassroots subcommittee developed a grassroots network that worked in support of a transportation funding package - capital and operating - in 2007 in Illinois. They accomplished this through volunteer letter writing and phone calling and legislative office visits. The Grassroots subcommittee also played a vital role in the success of the March 14th Transportation Lobby Day.





ILLINOIS CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS


